- 1. Purpose/Background.** The General Services Administration requires Federal agencies occupying federally owned or leased property to develop an Occupant Emergency Plan (OEP) to protect life and property during emergency conditions. An OEP establishes an organizational structure and procedures to quickly move occupants to safety, minimize property damage, and notify proper authorities during local emergencies. The Federal Management Regulation designates a Federal agency that is either the sole occupant or the primary occupant of a facility as being responsible for developing the OEP for that facility. The Federal Management Regulation further identifies the highest-ranking Federal official of that primary occupant agency as the official responsible for the OEP in that facility. This Directive updates U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) policy for the ICE Occupant Emergency Plan. It incorporates revised Department of Homeland Security (DHS) OEP requirements.


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
