DIRECTIVE TITLE: Maritime Operational Threat Response (MOTR) Policy

- 1. PURPOSE and SCOPE.** This directive establishes U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) policy regarding the roles, responsibilities and management of the Maritime Operational Threat Response (MOTR) for The National Strategy for Maritime Security (Plan).


