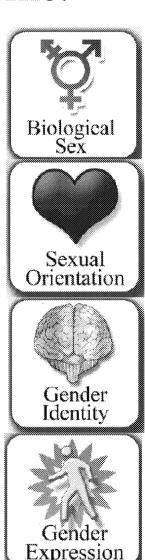
# LGBTQI+ Defined:

- Lesbian: Women who are romantically and/or sexually attracted to other women.
- **Gay:** Men who are romantically and/or sexually attracted to other men but can also be used for women who are romantically and/or sexually attracted to other women.
- Bisexual: Women and men who are romantically and/or sexually attracted to both women and men.
- Transgender: People whose assigned sex at birth does not match their internal sense of gender.
- Queer: An adjective used by people whose sexual orientation is not exclusively heterosexual. Once considered pejorative, the term has been reclaimed by some LGBTQI+ people to describe themselves.
- Questioning: A person who is in the process of discovering/exploring their own sexual orientation or gender identity.
- Intersex: A person born with the sexual anatomy that does not fit typical definitions of male or female.



# Familiarize Yourself with these Additional Terms:

- Sex (Assigned at Birth): A label -male or female- assigned at birth based on medical factors such as genitals, hormones, and chromosomes.
- Gender: One's social and cultural roles and expectations.
- Gender Identity: A person's internal sense of gender.
- Gender Expression: The ways in which people display their gender identity to others.
- Gender Nonconforming: People who do not follow gender stereotypes or traditional societal gender expectations.
- **Sexual Orientation:** A person's physical, romantic, and/or emotional attraction to another person.

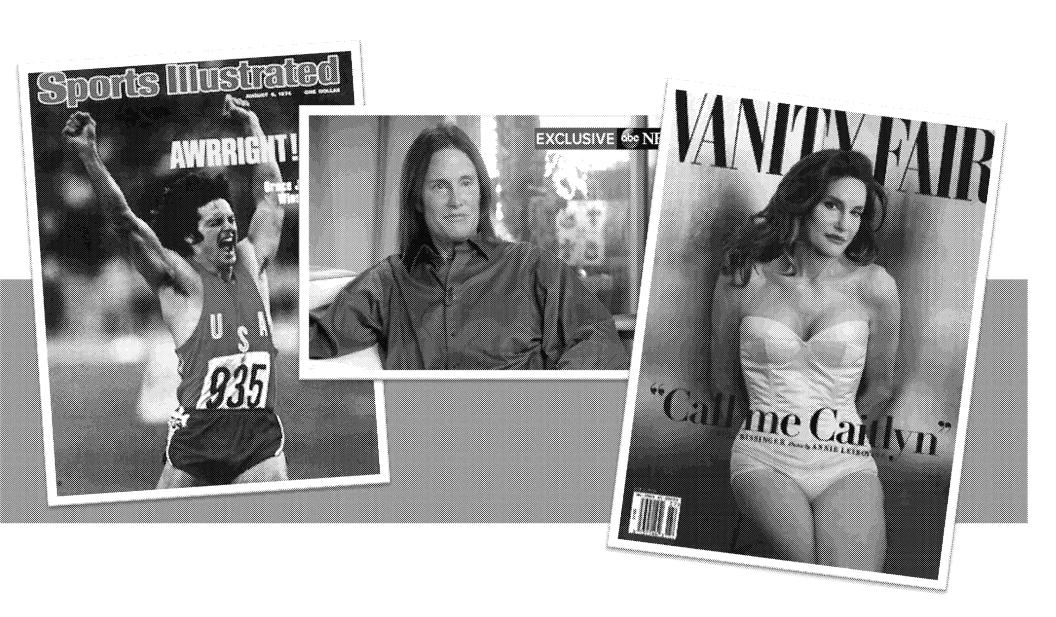
A person whose birth sex is female but understands himself to be, and desires to and/or lives as a man

# Can consist of:

- Social: Coming out to friends and family, New name/pronouns, Different clothing and expression (can include speaking, walking, mannerisms)
- Medical: Hormone therapy, Surgery, Hair removal
- Legal: Name change, Identity documents

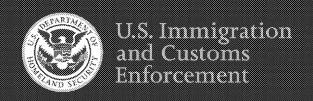












# Who are transgender immigrants?

- Come from all over the world
- Many are fleeing persecution
- May suffer from mental health issues

## May have faced:

- Abuse by police, gangs, or paramilitaries
- Criminal laws against being LGBTQI+
- Forced treatments to "cure" them
- Family rejection/mistreatment
- Homelessness
- Forced prostitution
- Physical or sexual assault/abuse in their home countries
- Physical or sexual abuse/ assault in detention



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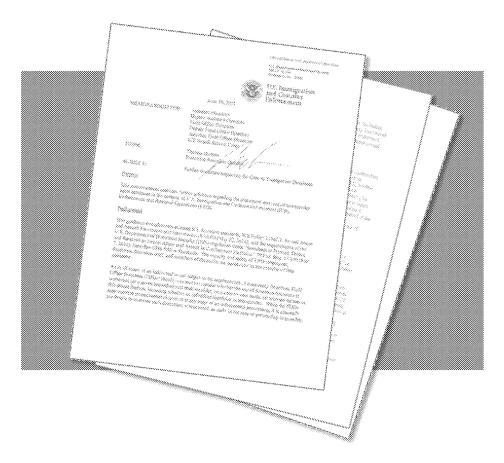
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# Transgender Care Memorandum



# **Applicability**

- The memorandum was signed by ERO Executive Associate Director (EAD) on June 19, 2015.
- The memorandum governs intake, identifying, processing, housing, and continuing care of transgender detainees by ERO personnel.
- The memorandum establishes a National ERO LGBTI Coordinator and requires each ERO Field Office Director (FOD) to designate a local ERO LGBTI Field Liaison.

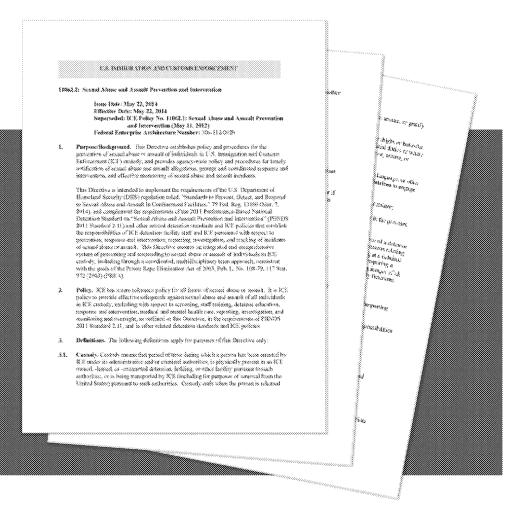

# Not New Policy

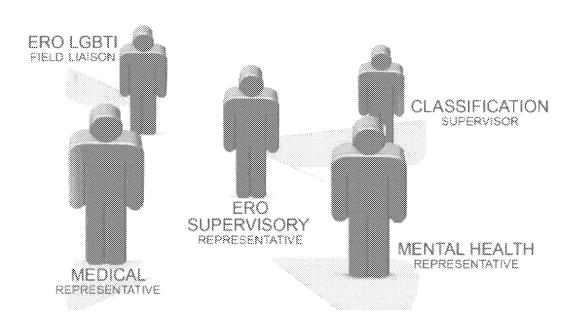
- The memorandum both complements and helps implement existing agency policies, such as:
  - ICE policy 11062.2: Sexual Abuse and Assault Prevention and Intervention (SAAPI) (May 22, 2014)
  - U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) regulation titled "Standards to Prevent, Detect, and Respond to Sexual Abuse and Assault in Confinement Facilities," 79 Fed. Reg. 13,100 (Mar.7, 2014), DHS PREA standards
  - ICE Policy 11022.1: Detainee Transfers (Jan. 4, 2012)





# **Contract Modification**

- Optional set of best practices and procedures to be adopted by facility partners.
- Transgender Classification and Care Committee (TCCC).
  - Provides a holistic classification assessment of the detainee
  - Created an Individualized Detention Plan



# (b)(7)(E)

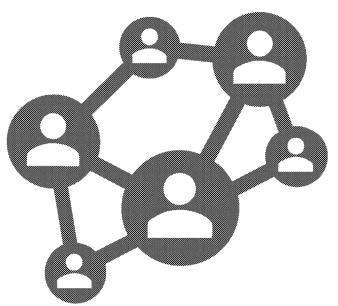
(b)(7)(E)

- Replaced "Gender" field with "Sex"
  - · Value choices are: female, male, unknown
- Added a "Transgender" field in the Person Details section.
  - Value choices are either Y Yes or N No (with option to leave blank).
  - Field auto-populates if Transgender = "Y Yes," was entered for Encounters in (b)(7)(E)
  - No LGBI field.
- (b)(7)(E) also adds an Alert for Transgender status.



# Housing Options:

- Can be housed like any other detainee:
  - General population (by sex assigned at birth or gender identify)
  - Protective Custody
  - ICE Dedicated Housing Unit for Transgender Detainees

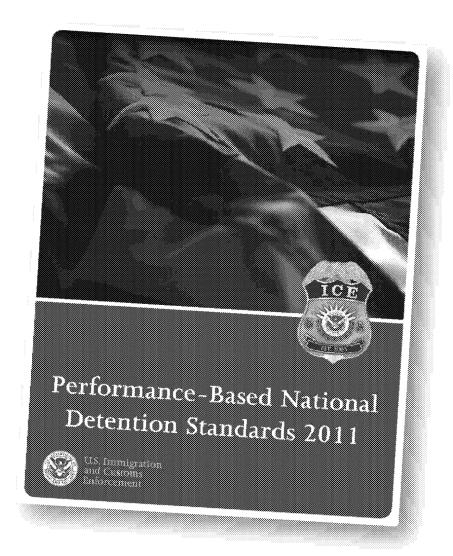




# 2011 Performance-Based National Detention Standards

### 4.3 Medical Care

- J. The screening shall ... 15. inquire into a transgender detainee's gender selfidentification and history of transitionrelated care, when a detainee selfidentifies as transgender;
- W. Transgender detainees who were already receiving hormone therapy when taken into ICE custody shall have continued access. All transgender detainees shall have access to mental health care, and other transgenderrelated health care and medication based on medical need. Treatment shall follow accepted guidelines regarding medically necessary transition-related care.

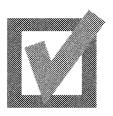

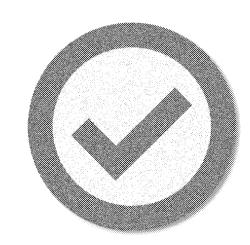

# LGBTQI+ Detainee Interaction Do's

# Do's:

- Resist the urge to label LGBTQI+ detainees before you know how they identify.
- Use transgender person's preferred pronouns and terminology.
  - Address the detainee by his or her chosen name.
    - When talking and when writing.
    - If you need to use legal name, let the detainee know why you're doing so.
  - If you're not sure what name or pronoun to use, ask the detainee.

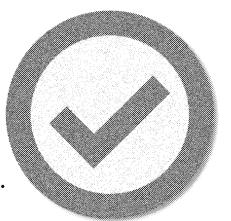




# LGBTQI+ Detainee Interaction Do's, Continued

# Do's:

- Respect confidentiality.
  - Do not reveal detainee gender identify or sexual orientation, unless necessary.
  - Acknowledge if questions are personal and/or painful and explain reason(s) for asking them.
  - Limit questions to "need to know," and not for curiosity.
  - Don't ask for unnecessary repetition of information.
- Many LGBTQI+ detainees are limited English proficient and require use of an interpreter.
  - When using an interpretation service, speak to, and make
    - eye contact with the detainee, not the interpreter.



# LGBTQI+ Detainee Interaction Don'ts

# Don'ts:

- Don't make "jokes" about detainees' sexual orientation or gender identity.
  - Even with other staff or non-LGBTQI+ detainees; these "jokes" lead to an environment that tolerates mistreatment of LGBTQI+ people.
- Don't judge a detainee's gender identity by his or her biological anatomy.
- Don't make assumptions based on stereotypes.
  - Do not assume a transgender detainee is gay.
  - Do not assume a transgender detainee is "flaunting his or her sexuality." because he or she is gender non-conforming.
