# Parents & Legal Guardians of Minor Children & Incapacitated Adults

Section 5.1 of the Directive requires at first encounters of noncitizens that ICE personnel affirmatively inquire into parental and legal guardianship status. And it states further, ICE personnel should generally inquire about the status during all encounters.

#### **Identification & Arrest Process**

Identify Noncitizen Parents & Legal Guardians at all Encounters

- Does the noncitizen a parent or legal guardian have:
  - o Minor child(ren) in the U.S., oro Incapacitated adult(s) in the U.S.?

AND:

 Is the noncitizen a primary caretaker

OR

- · Parent or legal guardian, AND
- An active child welfare, family court, or guardianship proceeding.

Note: if the noncitizen parent/legal guardian is taken into custody, a custody review will be required for noncitizens with active child welfare or quardianship proceedings.



Arrest of Parent or Legal Guardian

- Make sure to use the updated ICE Form 71-078 Caregiver Designation at Arrest, documenting the parent or legal guardian's caregiving arrangements.
- Place the ICE Caretaker
   Designation form into the A-file and document in (b)(7)(E)
- If Child Protective Services (CPS), Adult Protective Services (APS), or local law enforcement are called because the parent/legal guardian is unable to identify a caretaker, then this form should document that.



Document the Identification of a Covered Individual in EARM & I-213

- Enter a Parental Interests alert in (b)(7)(E) [TBD]
- Document information about minor child(ren) or incapacitated adult (name, age, immigration status, current location, caretaker info, child welfare/ family court proceedings, etc.).

Documenting information early can help expedite removal process later.



Document in (b)(7)(E) and the I-213 if CPS, APS, or local law enforcement were called to take custody of the child(ren)/incapacitated adults OR if the parent/legal guardian already has an open child welfare/family court proceeding If known include caseworker information/county of arrest.





### Custody




Initial placement or subsequent transfers should not be outside of the AOR of initial apprehension

UNLESS...

- Impracticable
- Dictated by Exceptional Circumstances

Placement should be as close as practicable to the minor child(ren) or incapacitated adult and/or location of the proceeding.

#### Pre-Removal Planning

Parent/Legal Guardian documents their decision on whether to reunify with dependents prior to removal...



Parents/Legal Guardians with Children/Incapacitated Adults (dependents) in U.S. (covered individuals\* only)

Provide the ICE Form 71-076 Pre-Removal Parental Interests Election\* to parent & legal guardians (upon final order of removal) who are:

Primary caretaker/custodians

Who are in child welfare/family court/guardianship proceedings.

# Reunification for joint repatriation:

- Requires Coordination with the current caretaker of the children.
- Coordinate with the <u>Field Office</u> <u>Juvenile Coordinator</u>.
- Contact ERO PI Coordinator if parent needs U.S. passport application forms for U.S. citizen child/ren.

NOTE: ICE WILL NOT INTERVENE IN CUSTODIAL DISPUTES IF THE CAREGIVER IS NOT WILLING TO COORDINATE. Consult ERO Parental interests Coordinator or OPLA with any questions.



## Transport & Booking Travel

# Ongoing Child Welfare/Family Court /Guardianship Proceedings

- FOD Pre-Removal Review (ICE Form 71-080): FODs must consider under the totality of circumstances whether continuing with removal is appropriate.
- Provide noncitizen opportunities to communicate with CPS or other stakeholders regarding their proceedings.
